Woughton Community Council (WCC)

WCC manages nine council estates in the south of the city. Recently, Tash Darling, Services Manager, reached out to us to help raise awareness of the support MKSS offers to people with sight and hearing loss.

We're excited to share that WCC's new building in Coffee Hall will soon become a hearing aid battery issuing centre. MKSS will provide training to WCC staff so they can offer this service locally. The building also has

rooms that could be used for hearing aid retubing, making it even easier for the community to access support.

Looking ahead to the new year, we plan to recruit volunteers who will be trained to deliver these services. If you live in the area and would like to get involved, please get in touch – we'd love to hear from you!


